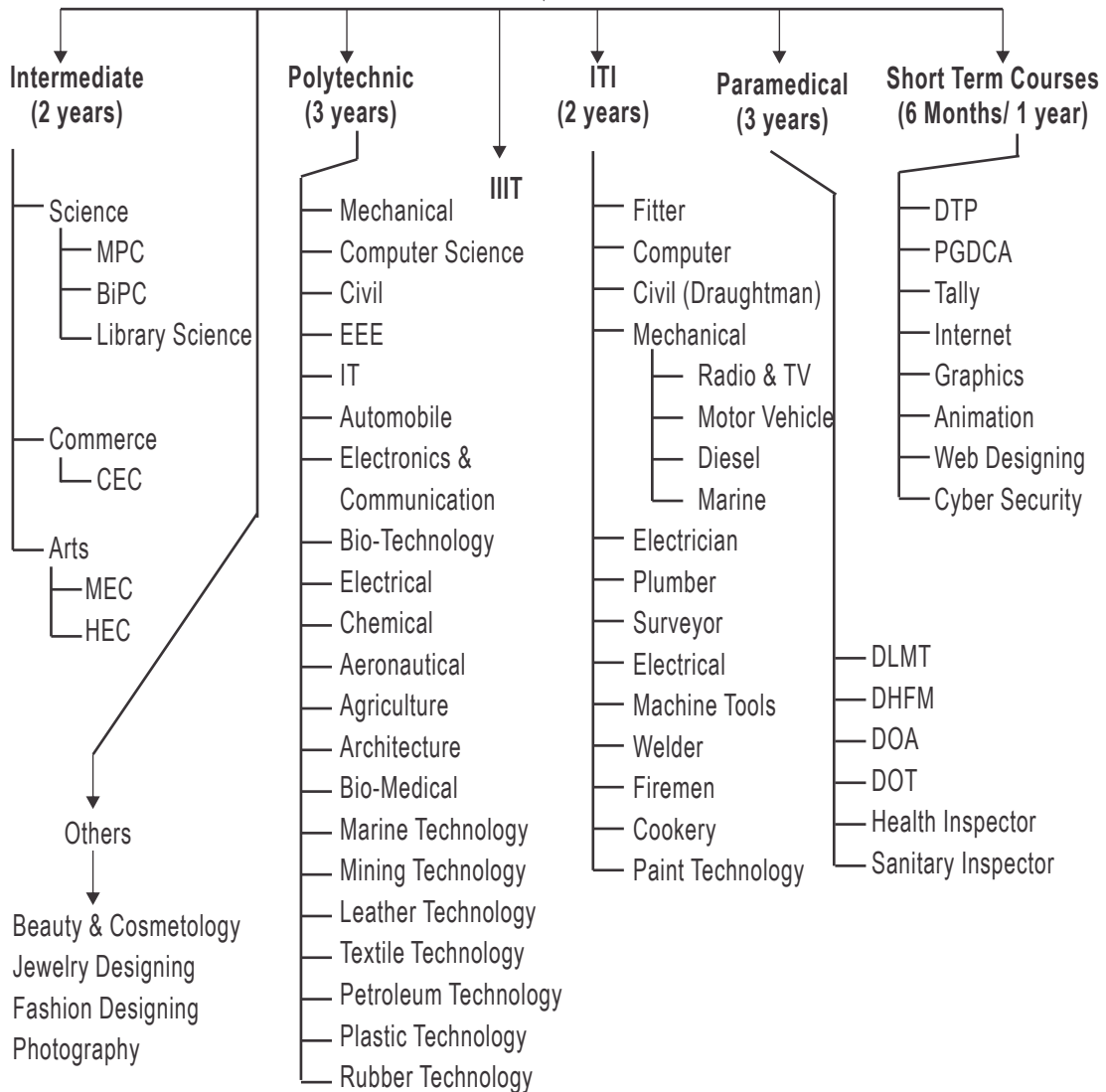

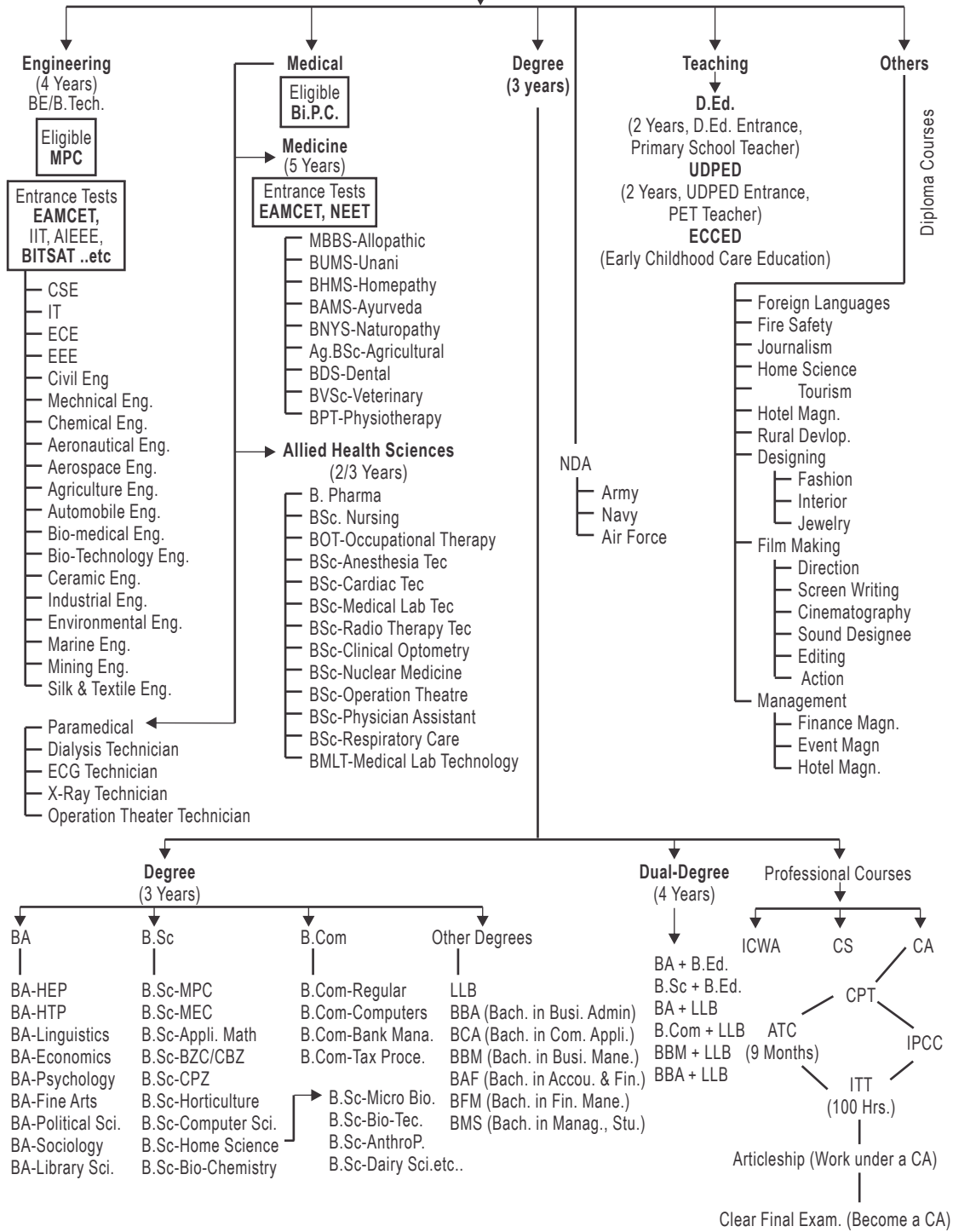

Note :- Students are allowed to wear black sandals from 16th June to 31st October. And black shoe is compulsory from 1st November to 14th June.

ADMISSIONS

01. New admissions are made subject to the vacancies. No correspondence will be entertained regarding admissions. The Management has the right to admit or refuse admission to the pupils in the School.
02. Parent/Guardian must note that they cannot question the management about admissions, selections and entrance tests procedure.
03. New admissions in Nursery have to produce an official Birth Certificate issued by a Hospital and the Birth Certificate issued by the Municipality in support of the date of birth to be entered in the Admission Form of the student for the School Record.
04. According to the Government regulation, only pupils who complete five- and-a-half years by the 1st of April can be admitted to standard 1 and corresponding scale of ages are fixed for the subsequent standards.

WITHDRAWALS

01. **In any case or reason, Leaving/Transfer Certificate of the Student studying in the school will not be issued between/during the session. Parent has to deposit the Twelve Months Fee of the ward before they apply for L.C.**
02. Application for withdrawal should be made on a prescribed L.C. Application which is attached with the Student's Diary.
03. The L.C. application form should be deposited in school office along with L.C. fee.
04. L.C. will be issued after 06 working days from the date of application.
05. Absentees with or without information once entered in the register have to deposit the school fee of that month and the whole year fee even if the irregularity continues.
06. No School Leaving Certificate is issued until all annual dues of the school been cleared and paid fully.

EXPECTATIONS FROM THE PARENT

01. The diary contains all the important rules and regulations and the record of the student's progress. Parents are, therefore, requested to look into it regularly.
02. If any communication regarding the student is to be sent, it should be mentioned in the diary.
03. The student is instructed to note down home assignments daily. You are requested to see that he/she does it properly and regularly.
04. The official methods of communication from the school will come through the circulars, SMS or the school diary. Kindly take note of the message whenever it is sent to you.
05. Parents/Guardians can be of great help in maintaining school discipline. Please send your children in proper school uniform. No relaxation will be granted as regards the school uniform except in genuine cases.
06. Teachers are very important for the students. Parents are requested to meet them on result day (PTM) or on working days by an appointment.
07. Teachers are parents of the students in the school. Encourage them to help the students to do better.
08. Teachers need the co-operation of the parents, co-operate them heartily and see how the students excel.
09. If the student falls ill, teachers are worried about his/her well-being. Inform them by sending a Medical/Leave Certificate or through telephonic information.
10. **Leave-letter** is compulsory and no student will be allowed to sit in the class without leave-note if he or she takes leave without prior permission.
11. Please inform the school office about the change of address to avoid the difficulties related to any correspondence or to contact during emergency. Parents are not allowed to meet the teachers during class-hours.
12. **Parents need to give home made food veg. only (Sabji Roti) for Tiffin. Junk food is banned in the school.**
13. Never pressurize the students instead motivate them to achieve their goal. By this they will bring positive change in their behavior and studies. Always appreciate even for their slight improvement and small achievement.
14. **Smoking and chewing tobacco are strictly banned within the school** premises for parents, guardians and visitors.
15. **Parents are requested not to take long leave for anything that is not very urgent.**
16. **Kindly send children school daily without fail.**

THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

01. The school lays as much emphasis on character formation, as on excellence in academics. Great stress is laid on **punctuality, regular attendance** and **discipline**. Absent without prior permission on the first day of class after any vacation will be taken as a serious concern. New admissions are liable to lose their seats if they fail to report within a week after the school re-opens.
02. **Students are advised to speak in English since it is the medium of instruction in the school, thereby, ensuring a certain level of proficiency.**
03. Pupils are expected to maintain a high standard of behavior and manner of speech. **Foul language** will not be entertained.
04. Pupils are answerable to the school authorities for their conduct both in and outside the school. Pupils shall always greet teachers, elders and friends in a pleasant manner. They shall be polite in speaking and avoid the use of slang and common expressions. They ought to conduct themselves in manner worthy to the dignity of a human being. Misbehavior justifies dismissal.
05. Every student must be in school before the warning bell, if pupils are late; they are liable to sent home, at the parent's risk. No child is permitted to leave the school premises during the recess or the school hours except with the permission of the Principal.
06. Children should take special care of the school property i.e. furniture, apparatus etc. Anybody who damages the school property will be punished. Any damage done to the school property will be charged from the students. It is their responsibility to keep the school premises clean.
07. Pupils are forbidden to take part in any political or other organizations likely to result in violence or communal disturbance.
08. No books other than those prescribed, may be brought to the school premises, without the permission of the school authorities.

09. **Chewing gums, perfumes, gel and costly items such as jewellery, wrist-watch, smart watch, i-pod, mobile phones, pen drives, lap-top, palm-top or any electronic gadgets are banned in the school. Such things will be confiscated from the students and in addition, they will be suitably punished.**
10. Every pupil should endeavor to keep up the high standards of the school, by excelling in every sphere of academic life. Pupils are not allowed to bring articles which may prove a source of disturbance.
11. **Pupils suffering from contagious or infectious diseases are not permitted in the school.**
12. Parents / Guardians are not allowed to see their children or to meet the teachers during school hours.
13. There is a process of parent-teacher meeting on Result day. All the parents are expected to attend the meetings without failure to keep a track of their ward's performance.
14. No presents or gifts to the teachers are allowed without the previous consent of the Principal. No collection for any purpose whatsoever is to be started without the permission of the Principal.
15. A record of the address of Parent/Guardian is maintained in the school office. Any changes should be promptly informed.
16. Students Performance Certificate and other certificates are issued only to those who leave school after completing the full course of the respective class and the examination for promotion in the next class. Their attendance and conduct must be satisfactory. The certificate may be taken within a year or else no such certificates are issued.

The School management reserves the right to add or amend any of these rules and the same have to be followed by the parent/guardian and pupils.

BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION

On Birthday students can wear moderate casual dress and distribute chocolates or donate books to school Library. Cake cutting ceremony, distribution of cakes and gifts are banned in the school.

MISCONDUCT

The school reserves the right to expel a student at any time for indulging in misconduct or any indiscipline cases. Such students depending on the severity of the offences may be handed over to the parents.

LIBRARY RULES

01. Perfect silence and order must be maintained in the Library.
02. Only one book at a time will be issued for not more than seven days. In case if he/she requires for a longer period, he/she can get it re-issued. If he/she has not submitted the book after seven days, he/she will be fined Rs. 2 per day.
03. A student must handle the books carefully.
04. Before the book is returned to the Library, the necessary entry must be made in the Handbook.
05. Students must return the Library books 15 days before the Examination.
06. Students need to pay 1.5 times of original price if a book is damaged or lost by a student.
07. A '**No Dues Certificate**' for each student is to be obtained from the Librarian while withdrawing any student from school.

COMPUTER LAB RULES

01. Students are not allowed to enter the lab in shoes and they need to keep their shoes outside the lab in order.
02. Students should not carry water bottles or any eatables to the lab.
03. Students are not allowed to use pen drives, CDs or any such memory devices in the lab.
04. Students are not permitted to surf internet without the permission or guidance of the teacher-in charge.
05. It is mandatory to shut down the computers before leaving and to keep the accessories properly in place.
06. Students are allowed to enter and do their work in the lab only under the presence of any teacher.

DUTIES OF THE PUPILS

01. To become an educated and cultured citizen and to do greatest possible service to the nation.
02. The medium of instruction is English. Students are expected strictly to speak in English in school premises.
03. To study diligently and be regular and punctual in attendance. Silence, solitude, prayer and perseverance are the indispensable conditions for success in studies.
04. To obey the instructions of the Principal and the teachers.
05. To come to school with all necessary textbooks and writing materials and be duly prepared for the lessons.
06. **To come to school clean, well-groomed and neatly dressed. Pupils coming without full uniform or dressed in a slovenly manner are not admitted in the classroom.**
07. To keep his/her place and classroom clean and tidy.
08. To enter the classroom and take his/her place immediately after the bell rings, enter and leave the classroom only with the teacher's permission.
09. To sit attentively during the lessons. Not to lean on his/her elbows or slouch to listen attentively to the teacher's explanation and other pupil's answer and not to talk or let his/her attention stray.
10. To respect when the Teacher/Teachers, the Principal enters or leaves the classroom.
11. To stand properly while answering the teacher/teachers and to sit down only with the teacher's permission; to raise his/her hand if he/she wishes to answer or ask questions.
12. To take accurate notes in his/her assignment books or homework scheduled for the next lesson and to show these notes to his/her parents.
13. To be respectful to the Principal and the teachers, greet them politely and courteously.

14. To be attentive and considerate to old people, small children, the weak and the sick, to give them a seat in the bus or train or make way for them on the street, being helpful in every way.
15. To obey parents and to help them in the care of younger brothers and sisters.
16. To carry the student's diary with him/her always, to show it when asked by the Principal or the teachers.
17. To cherish the honor of the school and class and to defend it as his/her own.
18. To avoid going to washrooms during the class hours except for emergencies.
19. Not to move about in the premises or be in any other classroom that is not his/her own.
20. Not to spit on the floor, through the windows and anywhere in the school compound.
21. To note down in student diary assignment or any information given by teachers.
